We perform up to 8 regular productions each year both on main stage and in the Playhouse Bar Studio, as well as numerous rehearsed readings and plays.

Everyone is now in the loop

After months of work, a new internal communications system has been introduced across the whole Playhouse.



What's happening at Halifax Playhouse

The installation of new wiring, speakers, monitors and systems is ensuring that all Front of House staff – bar, kiosk and house manager - plus technical crews on sound and lighting are aware of what is happening during productions – and what is coming up.

This ensures the smooth and efficient operation of the building during normal situations and in the case of emergencies.

In particular new hearing loops – with batons where necessary on deposit – are operating both in the main auditorium and Studio Bar.

There is also widespread show relay with monitors in dressing rooms and other strategic places to allow casts and others to measure progress by seeing what is happening on stage through video.

The system enables recorded messages – for instance warning of the start of a show – to be played and controlled in appropriate places, and ambient music to be delivered. Input of sound and emergency messages from stations around the theatre is also now possible.

Higher prices – but still value for money

High inflation and new taxes have forced a review of prices for Playhouse kiosk and bar sales, causing complications in the process.

For a number of years, the sweet and ice cream kiosk has been able to maintain a simple price list of £1 for a bag of sweets and £2 for an ice cream.

Now increasing wholesale prices have already forced ice cream prices to rise to £2.50 – still less than comparable venues in town. Attempts are being made to keep sweet prices down but inevitable they will become complicated as packet prices rise by varying amounts.


Similarly, the complicated new alcohol taxes announced in the last budget have resulted in wholesale prices rising by 10%, resulting in a review of how this affects profits – all of which are used to maintain the Playhouse. A new price list will be introduced when our theatre reopens in February.

BEHIND THE SCENES

Stories about writers of Thespians shows

Born in Warrington in 1955, Miles Tredinnick, author of Twist was known in the 1970s as Riff Regan, lead singer of the punk band London. From 1985 to 1992 Tredinnick wrote regular stage and television scripts for Frankie Howerd including an updated stage version of

Up Pompeii!



USA and in 2018 had a UK tour by the Baroque Theatre Company.

In 1986 Tredinnick started writing for the international Disney Magazine creating cartoon stories for Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck, and Goofy.

His first novel Fripp, was published in 2001.

Eddie Robson author of Welcome to our Village, Please Invade Carefully has written in a wide range of media including works of fiction, comic strips, non-fiction and for children as well as working as a freelance journalist for various science fiction magazines.



Born in 1978, he became known for his work on a variety of spin-offs from the BBC Television series Doctor Who, Children's television,

episodes of Hollyoaks and has also written for the Theatre. He is married and lives in Lancaster.

The pilot for Welcome to our Village ... first aired on BBC Radio 2 on 5 July 2012. From that a series of the sitcom was developed for Radio 4

Neil Anthony Docking, author of The Revlon Girl is a British writer, composer and producer.

He was born in South Wales, and studied music at the University of Westminster before finding work as a writer in press, television, radio and film, where his credits include Casualty,

Emmerdale, Nuts & Bolts, The Throne Room, Station Road and most recently, he has written for theatre, where The Revlon Girl, his first



play, received not just an Olivier Nomination, but also a number of awards.

He has wrote both the original screenplay and music score for the independent British feature film musical Rain and, in 2016, wrote and produced the original online comedy Storyline.

Changes in the Studio Bar

Phase One of the Playhouse Studio Bar refurbishment has been completed. The serving area has been stripped back to bare walls and refitted with new stainless steel bar unit complete with quartz bar top and motorised shutter. New cooler units have been installed, plus extra work top space, and a new sink and wash hand basin. A fridge with freezer section and new ice maker complete the changes.

But one of the most significant differences is the introduction of reuseable polycarbonate glassware. For most productions, patrons take their drinks into the auditorium; previously this meant transferring them into single-use plastic.

The new glassware (which is washed in a new machine) has done away with such eco-unfriendly practices (and costs) and is so successful that many patrons don't actually realise they are not using glass. The move has also meant that collecting empty glassware is now easier and less precarious for staff, who find serving much easier.

Work is now beginning on Phase Two, which will see the banquettes re-upholstered, the walls and woodwork repainted and a new carpet fitted.

All this refurbishment has been made possible through a bequest from long-standing stalwart of the Thespians Margot Lawson.
