On 2 August 1961, Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington, which had been saved for the nation by a special treasury grant, was put on display at The National Gallery in London. Nineteen days later it was stolen.

Four years after the theft, Kempton Bunton, a 61-year-old unemployed former bus driver from Benwell, Newcastle, baffled Scotland Yard detectives by confessing to the theft. Had this heavily built, antisocial, bespectacled Geordie really outwitted the gallery's sophisticated security?

The case sparked a national sensation and Susan Wear wrote the play after reading secret Director of Public Prosecution papers relating to the case. The recent film version starred Jim Broadbent and Helen Mirren.

Farewell to Peter and Nigel



Peter Thurman 1945-2024

Peter Thurman, one-time chairman of the Thespians and participant in many areas of the Playhouse's operation died on December 6th 2024.

As an actor, director, set builder, handyman, sound designer and operator Peter served the Thespians for many years – so much so that at his funeral in a packed Halifax Minster, his son John said the Playhouse was his second home.

Peter was a teacher, retiring early, and became a college administrator before completing his working life as a wine merchant delivery driver.



Nigel Town 1957-2024

Nigel Town who has designed many of the posters for Thespians Plays in recent years, died suddenly at the end of December.

Born and brought up in Hemel Hempstead, Nigel moved North around 20 years ago and joined Halifax Thespians soon afterwards. In his youth he was offered a place at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art (RADA) but was unable to take it up.

He acted, directed and was a leading member of the Bar Committee. He was part of the team that organises the Playhouse Open Mics, as cajon player in the Playhouse and Gastric Gas Band.

Behind Thespians Plays

Usually, when TV sitcoms are presented on stage, someone has already made the adaptation. But with **Blackadder Goes Forth** - the first Thespians play of the year, from March 18th – member Alistair Cheetham got special permission to do so after extensive requests and detailing how he intended to stage it.

Since first writing this adaptation in 2015, Alistair's version of the TV series has been performed as far afield as Canada, Australia and New Zealand, but he is delighted to bring this production, which he will also be directing, back to West Yorkshire.

After issues over licences to perform, The Thespians have chosen a play called *Maggie May* for the second production of the year. To be performed in the Studio Bar from April 22nd, the work by Francis Poet is an extraordinary drama about an ordinary family who must balance the challenges of daily life whilst living with dementia, whose only relief is Rod Stewart songs.


What a turn up!

One of the Playhouse Studio Bar's walls is underground, and it has been decided to 'tank' the wall to protect it from damp and other ingress.

It was expected to be a fairly straightforward piece of work, but when contractors began stripping the wall, they had a big surprise: they uncovered a window that no-one currently managing the theatre, had any idea was there!

As the work continues the window will be boarded up again. It would be interesting to hear from any members who have any recollection of the window - or know anything about it.





When *The Ghost Train* by Arnold Ridley is performed by the Thespians in May 2025 it will be a Centenary production. For the play was first produced at the St Martin's Theatre, London, on November 23rd 1925.

Curtain Up editor, Ian Byfield, as a newspaper Arts correspondent, interviewed Arnold Ridley, when he was on tour with the Dad's Army stage show. After a short chat about Mr Ridley's writing and acting career, the playwright (who was over 80 at the time) burst out: "Why are you going on about things in the past – why don't you ask me about my future?"

Ian had further connections with *The Ghost Train* when after seeing a performance at Bradford Alhambra was able to chat with two of its stars: Bill Maynard and – coincidentally - Ian Lavender (Pike in *Dad's Army*).
